The Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarships

The Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Board, in partnership with industry and the Government of Alberta, created the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Board Family of Scholarships.

The Family of Scholarships includes the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarships and the Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) Scholarships. Combined, over 650 scholarships are available annually.

These awards are intended to recognize excellence and encourage registered apprentices and trainees to complete their apprenticeship or occupational training programs.

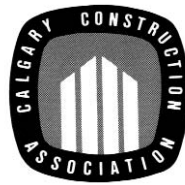

Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarships

The Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Board, private industry and the Government of Alberta teamed up to create the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarships. Joint contributions created an endowment of approximately \$3.3 million. A list of the named scholarships sponsored by major contributors from the private sector is included in this application.

The Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarships are designed to recognize the excellence of Alberta apprentices in a trade, and trainees in a designated occupation, and to encourage recipients to complete their apprenticeship or occupational training programs.

Award

The scholarships are valued at \$1,000 each.

Eligibility

Applicants for an Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarship must be both

- ◆ a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant; and
- ◆ an Alberta resident, as defined by Alberta Scholarship Programs.

Of the approximately 165 scholarships awarded annually, some:

- ◆ have a financial need component,
- ◆ are designated for a specific trade or occupation,
- ◆ are designated for applicants of Aboriginal descent,
- ◆ are for women in non-traditional trades.

To be considered for a scholarship, an Employer Recommendation form **must be completed** and attached to the application or mailed separately.

Applicants must include two or three paragraphs telling about themselves. Include what they enjoy about their trade, why they chose a career in the trades and how this scholarship will benefit them.

Other basic eligibility requirements depend on whether the applicant is registered in a trade with **more than one period of technical training**, in a trade with only **one period of technical training**, or in a **designated occupation**.

Trades with more than one period of technical training

To be eligible for an Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarship in trades with more than one period of technical training, applicants must

- ◆ be registered as an Alberta apprentice in a trade,
- ◆ have passed their first or subsequent period apprenticeship and industry training exam between August 1, 2005 and July 31, 2006, and
- ◆ have at least one more period of technical training remaining in their program.

Cheques will be available to scholarship recipients when their attendance at the next period of technical training is confirmed. Scholarship recipients will be informed of when and how to obtain their cheques.

Recipients must qualify for and claim their awards within 5 years of being notified of their award.

Trades with only one period of technical training

To be eligible for an Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarship in trades with only one period of training, applicants must

- ◆ be registered as an Alberta apprentice, and
- ◆ have passed their apprenticeship and industry training exam between August 1, 2005 and July 31, 2006.

Cheques will be available to scholarship recipients when they have completed all requirements for their trade certificate.

Recipients must qualify for and claim their awards within 5 years of being notified of their award.

- ◆ must have passed the apprenticeship and industry training exam between August 1, 2005 and July 31, 2006.

- ◆ must submit, with their application form, a notarized copy of their NAIT Continuing Education Certificate - Gas Utility Operator issued between August 1, 2005 and July 31, 2006.

Cheques will be available to scholarship recipients when they have completed all requirements for their occupational certificate.

Recipients must qualify for and claim their awards within 5 years of being notified of their award.

Selection

Selection of scholarship recipients is made by a committee established by the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Board.

Recipients will be selected on the basis of their marks, employer recommendation and description about themselves. Financial need will also be considered in selecting recipients for scholarships with a financial need component.

The Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarships are awarded on a competitive selection basis. In the first three years of offering these scholarships, one in five applicants received a scholarship.

When applying for an Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarship:

A. Ensure your application is neat and legible.

B. Before mailing, make sure:

- you have used the current year's application form (2006)
- all** of the questions applicable to you have been answered
- your apprentice / trainee I.D. number and Alberta Student Number (if known) are included
- the completed Employer Recommendation form is either stapled to your application or has been mailed directly to Alberta Scholarship Programs
- the completed Financial Information form is stapled to your application if you wish to be considered for those scholarships with a financial need component.

Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarships

In 2001, industry partners teamed up with the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Board and the Government of Alberta. Industry's goal was to raise \$1 million to create a new provincial scholarship program for apprentices, and trainees in designated occupations.

One year later, in a strong show of support, industry raised over \$1.3 million in contributions. With funds contributed by the Government of Alberta, an endowment of \$3.3 million was created. The new Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarships were established.
