4 Hospitalized In Minden Head-on Crash

An accident Friday morning about 9.15 a.m. at the far end of the cutoff by Norman Harrison's Minden garage hospitalized four people. The driver of one car was Dalton Ruth, and the other car was driven by Rev. Shmidt, the Pentecostal minister in the Haliburton area. Shmidt's three passengers were a woman and two children. All people in the accident were injured with the exception of a small boy in the Shmidt car who was only severely shaken up.
